Cherokee, North Carolina with the Eastern Band of the Cherokee Nation. Located in western North Carolina the town of Cherokee is home to a large population of Cherokee Indians. Throughout the area are numerous neighborhoods and families in great need.

Groups will have the chance to reach out to these struggling families by helping with home repair and renovation. For this impoverished area, even the smallest amount of help brings new hope.

Your youth have an opportunity to put their faith into action through hands on projects while showing the love of Christ to people who are struggling to just get by.

Dates: July 11-17, 2010

Place: Cherokee, North Carolina

**Lodging:**

Groups will stay just off the reservation outside of Cherokee in college dorms at Western Carolina University with use of Chapel, pool, dining hall, and recreation facilities. All meals are provided except one lunch and two dinners during free time.

**Typical Schedule:**

Sunday: Registration begins at 6:00 pm. Orientations, music & program.

Monday: Work on the mission projects. Cookout. Evening music & program.

Tuesday: Work on the mission projects. Sports & games night. Evening music & program.

Wednesday: Work on the mission projects. Evening music & program.

Thursday: Work on the mission projects until lunch. Free afternoon. Native American dinner & cultural experience.

Friday: Free day. Evening closing worship service.

Saturday: Depart by 10:00 am.

**Cost: \$369/person**

**Plus cost of transportation**

**Registration fee: \$69.00 due in church office no later than March 25, 2010**

We currently have 18-spaces reserved but we have until March 25 to adjust our count. We are responsible for paying for the number we have reserved by April 1, 2010. Each participant is responsible to pay his/her own registration fee of \$69.00. A registration information sheet must accompany your registration fee. Heifer Ranch Summer Action

July 25-30, 2010

Perryville, Arkansas

Summer Action is primarily an education program that also includes service projects. Registrants will participate in activities that teach them more about world hunger,

Heifer International's mission and perhaps most importantly about themselves. They will learn about their role as global citizens and about how their choices affect the lives of others. They will learn they are a part of a global community and they have the power to make decisions to improve the lives of others.

Throughout the week registrants will participate in Challenge Course activities and have the option to sign-up for service projects or additional education programs. Service projects include helping with general Ranch chores, gardening, working with livestock, composting, and other Ranch projects.

The service groups perform help maintain the Ranch so that it remains an active Heifer International community where people can learn more about working to end world hunger and poverty while caring for the earth. Additional education programs involve hands-on activities that teach more about Heifer International's mission and how the participants can make a difference.

Sign-up activities are meant to allow registrants some flexibility in designing their program as they pick the activities that interest them.

Summer Action: July 25-30, 2010. This program runs 7 p.m. Sunday – 11:00 a.m. Friday. The program is open to youth 12 years and older with an accompanying adult chaperone. Each adult can bring up to five youth.

Summer Action tuition is \$335 per person to include all educational programming (Global Gateway, low and uplifting Challenge activities, service projects and additional educational activities), lodging and meals.

Participants will sign-up each day for various service projects and educational programs. Participants will spend one night in the Village and four nights in a modern climate-controlled lodge. Each room in the lodge has two single beds and a private bath. Each room will be assigned two people. Individuals are responsible for their own transportation to and from the Ranch.

The Junior-High Sunday school of Kernersville Moravian Church have been working with and raising money to purchase livestock for Heifer Project International for at least the past three to four years. This is a very special opportunity to these young missionaries to visit a highly respected world renowned mission organization that has certainly weathered the test of time and service.

This is a hands-on experience for our young missionaries as we strive to help teach them and give them missionary training learning experiences for more mission work as they age.

**Registration fee: \$35.00 per person**

**Cost: \$335.00 per person**  
**Plus cost of transportation**

We currently have 10 spaces reserved. We can increase that number but we must do so by March 6. Too, for all participants, adults and youth, registration fees must be received in the church office no later than March 6. Please do not allow this date to slip by as it is upon us. This date was determined by the Heifer Organization due to the large demand for this Summer Action Ranch Mission Camp.
